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Activities that have 44 working days or more total float are suspect and may require review. A good rule is that not more than 5% of your schedule's total activities should have high float. If your schedule exceeds this threshold you will need to examine each activity with high float.

General Scheduling Guidelines - Ten Six Consulting

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Physician schedules should be finalized at least 2 but preferably 3 months in advance so parents can schedule their child's next appointment before they leave the office. Practices should not be continually changing a physician's schedule, resulting in having to reschedule patients.

Provider Scheduling Limitations to scheduling are based on scope of practice and must be pre-approved by clinic management team. A. All primary care providers (except HIV) are given one 20 minute appointment slot at the beginning of each day for team planning and 40 minutes at the end of the day (60 minutes for 10 hour providers).

Sample Provider Staffing and Scheduling Policy

Internists traditionally design schedules around 15 minute time increments, thus producing standard appointments of 15, 30 and 45 minute durations. In contrast, pediatric practices, and some family practice groups, tend to use 10 minute increments with resulting planned visits of 10, 20, 30 and 40 minutes.

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Reduce Scheduling Complexity Improving Primary Care Access
Complex schedules, with many appointment types, times, and restrictions, can actually increase total delay in the system because each appointment type and time creates its own differential delay and queue. Reducing the complexity ultimately decreases system delays.
