Arteriovenous malformations; Cluster headache; Hypertension, Hemorrhage; Eye disorders (Glaucoma) Sinusitis, Sub-arachnoid hemorrhage, Systemic illnesses, Seizures, pSeudotumor cerebri.

The differential diagnosis depends on the clinical picture and includes: Headache not associated with an underlying condition – primary headache: Migraine. Tension-type headache. Trigeminal autonomic cephalgias for example cluster headache and paroxysmal hemicranias.

Approach [4]. Diagnostic evaluation should be performed based on risk stratification and the suspected diagnosis.. Low-risk headache: No routine laboratory tests or imaging are recommended. High-risk headache: Consider diagnostic workup based on the suspected diagnosis.; Primary headache is a clinical diagnosis and typically does not require laboratory or imaging evaluation.

Differential Diagnosis of Headache

The single most important question when developing a differential diagnosis for a headache is, “Is this headache new or old?” Chronic headaches tend to be primary, while new-onset headaches are usually secondary. This is the first and most important pivotal point in diagnosing headaches. This distinction is not perfect.

Once those are considered and felt to be unlikely, you can expand your differential to include the more common and benign causes of a headache, such as migraine, tension, cluster, idiopathic ...

Grand Rounds: Headache, Part I—Differential Diagnosis and ...

In a patient with a prior history of migraine, worsening of headache in response to head trauma is considered to be an aggravation of migraine. Diagnosis is made on the basis of the history. Post-traumatic headache is diagnosed only when a new type of headache begins for the first time within 7 days of head or neck injury.
