In 1980, it was translated into English by Margaret Rose and David Toby Homel then re-published under the name The King's Daughter by Groundwood Books. During the early 1990s the book was challenged for its content and subsequently in 1994 it was re-printed with the offensive passages edited out and included a warning about the content of the book.

The King's Daughters (French: filles du roi; filles du roy) is a term used to refer to the approximately 800 young French women who immigrated to New France between 1663 and 1673 as part of a program sponsored by King Louis XIV of France. The program was designed to boost New France's population both by encouraging male colonizers to settle there, and by promoting marriage, family formation and the birth of children.

The colonial officials sent several of the filles du roi back to France because they were deemed below the standards set out by the king and the Intendant of New France. As was the case for most emigrants who went from France to New France, 80% of the filles du roi were from the Paris, Normandy and the western regions. Almost half were from the Paris area, 16% from Normandy and 13% from western France.
