This is a medieval European (fantasy) setting, with the following (highly tentative) parameters: Each town is vaguely autonomous, and have their own municipal government system. Towns do trade with each other, but are not exactly dependent on said trade. Towns vary in size from the rural village (pop. ~400) to a more prosperous city (pop. ~6000).
