Communications between attorney and client are privileged and do not have to be disclosed to the court. To be privileged, the communication must: Be only between the person and the professional advisor. In firms with more than one professional, the privilege extends to the other professionals (in a law firm, for example), but not to staff. Be only to a professional acting in his or her capacity as a professional.
