The Role of Supervision in Social Work: A critical analysis

Supervision involves supervisors providing support for staff members with different aspects of their role. The supportive function can help to address any emerging issues that may impact staff performance and/or wellbeing. For supervisors, this function might include: supporting staff with any challenges in their role.

Supervision - Skills for Care

Through regular, structured meetings with a supervisor, care staff can develop their understanding and improve their practice. What is supervision? The primary functions of supervision are: administrative case management; reflecting on and learning from practice; personal support; professional development; and mediation, in which the supervisor acts as a bridge between the individual staff member and the organisation they work for.
