A near miss is an event that could have been a workplace accident had things played out differently. Near miss reporting isn't required by federal OSHA but it is a common safety management practice. Keep a record of—and respond to—close call events to reduce the likelihood an injury or illness will occur.

### The Near-Miss Management of Operational Risk.

A "near miss" is an unplanned event that did not result in injury, illness, or damage - but had the potential to do so. Sometimes called a "near hit" or "close call" - signals a system weakness that, if not corrected, could lead to significant consequences in the future. PPT-041-01

If something is repeatedly reported as a near miss, the committee will begin to look deeper into the problem to get at its root. Management needs to involve employees as part of the safety management committee, as well as in the implementation of changes. Feedback then needs to be sought regarding how these changes worked.

### Near Misses: What They Are and Why You Should Report Them

A near miss is an unintentional incident that could have caused damage, injury or death but was narrowly avoided. In the context of safety, a near miss may be attributed to human error, or might be a result of faulty safety systems or processes in an organization. A near miss may also be called a close call, near collision or near hit.

### What is a Near Miss? - Definition from safepedia

A near miss is defined as "any event that could have had adverse consequences but did not and was indistinguishable from fully fledged adverse events in all but outcome." (Some studies use the related terms "potential adverse event" and "close call.")

Reporting near misses also helps shift the conversation from "the blame game" to "lessons learned", which translates to an overall positive work environment. ( Note : One way to reinforce this idea is to use near miss reporting software that allows anonymous reporting.)

"Near misses" can be defined as minor accidents or close calls that have the potential for property loss or injury. A near miss will prevent a task from being completed as planned. Most accidents can be predicted by close calls. These are accidents that almost happened or possibly did happen but simply didn't result in an injury this time around.
