Third: The right to have rights should be recognized as a precondition for the protection of every human right. Arendt locates the particularity of the human, as a member of a political community, in the condition that allows her to act as a political and linguistic being. Here, the political aspect conforms to the existential condition of one who, by definition, lives in a community, while the linguistic aspect is related to the human power of speech and thought.

### Hannah Arendt: The Right to Have Rights

It is conventional to conceive of justice as a negotiation between the conflicting rights of members of a community. By contrast, the "right to have rights" insists that justice is at stake in the negotiation between the rights of members of a community and the rights of those who are not members of any community. This is to say, politics is about negotiating the participatory boundaries of community.

Arendt's very invention of the "right to have rights" should be understood not merely as a theoretical gesture, but also as an active attempt to intervene in the situation of refugees, by bringing into focus, and critically contesting, the conditions that make possible their exclusion from political community.

Since then, and especially in recent years, theorists have continued to grapple with the meaning of the right to have rights. Hannah Arendt offered one of the most powerful criticisms of human rights in the light of the problems of statelessness and ended her critique with a rearticulation of human rights: "a right to have rights."
