Where their worm dieth not, and the fire is not quenched—See on [1468]Mt 5:30; The "unquenchableness" of this fire has already been brought before us (see on [1469]Mt 3:12); and the awfully vivid idea of an undying worm, everlastingly consuming an unconsumable body, is taken from the closing words of the evangelical prophet (Isa 66:24), which seem to have furnished the later Jewish Church with its current phraseology on the subject of future punishment (see Lightfoot).

44 [a]where. 'Their worm does not die. And the fire is not quenched.'. 45 And if your foot causes you to sin, cut it off. It is better for you to enter life lame, rather than having two feet, to be cast into [b]hell, [c]into the fire that shall never be quenched— 46 where. 'Their worm does not die.

Mark 9:44-48 NKJV - where 'Their worm does not die And ...

Mark 9:48 is a description: "where their worm does not die and the fire is not quenched." This verse is found within a larger portrayal of the horrors of hell, which utilizes a place called Gehenna—the garbage dump of ancient Jerusalem—as an illustration.

What is the worm that will not die mentioned in Mark 9:48?

Some believe that Jesus refers to sinners as worms and says that those people would never die but would live on in agonizing torment. Those who say this fail to notice that Jesus does not call wicked people "worms," but speaks of "their worm."The original Greek word for worm means "grub" or "maggot.". Jesus refers to a local method of garbage disposal to emphasize the permanent consequences of ...

What Does Jesus Mean by 'Their Worm Does Not Die' (Mark 9 ...

This figurative language stressed the point that whatever stood in the way of faithfulness to God should be discarded. Jesus concluded that it was better to be rid of stumbling blocks than “to go to hell, into the fire that shall never be quenched—where 'their worm does not die and the fire is not quenched' ” (Mark 9:43-44,46,48).

But in His sermon Jesus places adjacent to the well-known flames this unusual phrase: "...where their worm does not die..." Thrives off decaying flesh Observe first of all that the fire is never quenched, nor does their worm ever die.

So, obviously the phrase “their worm does not die” is symbolic in its meaning. Some believe that the undying worm is a symbol of a soul which cannot die. But there is nothing in the word skōlēx, “worm,” that backs the popular explanation equating “worm” with “soul” (Isa. 66:24). And this fact is recognized by almost all commentators.

What does the phrase “their worm does not die” mean ...

For their worm will not die and their fire will not be quenched; and they will be an abhorrence to all mankind." In Mark, Jesus is stating that in hell there is "unquenchable fire" (Mark 9:43) where the "worm does not die and the fire is not quenched," (vv. 44, 46, 48). Jesus is using the Old Testament phraseology from Isaiah 66:24.

Annihilationism, Isaiah 66:24 and Mark 9:47-48, worm dies ...

The Jewish people often associated the Valley of Hinnom with spiritual death. In Mark 9:48, when Jesus says, “Where their worm does not die and the fire is not quenched” (ESV), He is quoting from Isaiah 66:24: “They will go out and look on the dead bodies of those who rebelled against me; the worms that eat them will not die, the fire that burns them will not be quenched, and they will be loathsome to all mankind.”.

Most translations, particularly more literal ones, render the text “will not,” “shall not” or “does not” die. That’s all that the author says as part of the idiom. This doesn’t stop Robert Morey from writing that “Christ used the phrases ‘unquenchable fire’ and ‘never-dying worms’.” 2 Morey, R. Death and the Afterlife (Bethany House, 1984), 89.

Their Worm Never Dies, We Do Not Live in a Free America ...

In verse 44, the phrase where their worm dieth not, and the fire is not quenched is an allegorical expression referring to the conditions that the damned will encounter during their endless punishment- the worm allegorical of the sufferings of the body from internal torment, and the fire being allegorical of the sufferings for the body a hostile environment..

What does the term "their worm dieth not" mean?

For their worm does not die, and their fire is not quenched.” We are told in so many words that the agencies of “worm” and “fire” are working, not upon disembodied spirits, but upon bodies—dead bodies. The word “hell” used in Mark 9:43–48 is from the Greek word gehenna, or geenna.
